Worshipful hymns prepare the soul to receive the Holy Spirit's teaching, fortify it for the spiritual conflict, and move the heart of God to draw near with His presence. As evidenced when Israel won a great victory over the children of Ammon and Moab when the singers went before Jehoshaphat's outnumbered army (2 Chronicles 20), God loves singing and pours out blessings and rewards to those who sing heartily in the beauty of holiness.

This collection of hymns provides Scriptural teachings of the new birth, spiritual warfare, obedience to Christ, deceitfulness of riches, separation from the world, cross-bearing, nonresistance, and brotherhood. Drawn from centuries of Christian experience, it provides a window into the depths of Anabaptist beliefs and music heritage. Amish, Mennonites, and others who sing from German hymnals such as the *Ausbund*, *Unparteiische Liedersammlung*, *Lieder Sammlung*, and *Unpartheyisches Gesangbuch* may recognize a number of these hymns.

Adapted from the *Zion's Harp*, *Zion's Hymns* has been formatted to make accessible this strengthening collection of poetry and music for those who have learned to sing using shaped notes. It also includes author and composer information that has been omitted from earlier editions possibly due to persecution.

We give thanks to God for inspiring His servants to create and preserve this rich spiritual heritage of hymns. For those who wrote the convicting exhortations and expressions contained in these verses, while standing strong in the midst of martyrdom or apostasy, we are grateful. We also give thanks to the Apostolic Christian and Nazarene churches who labored diligently and contributed abundantly to translate these precious hymns of faith and carry them along wherever they took the Word of God. Currently available in several languages, this collection of hymns is in use around the world.

May God richly bless all those who have contributed or are contributing to the promotion and preservation of sound doctrine in song, and may He receive the sacrifice of praise continually as we lift up our voices to exalt His name.
